Enter one of Colorado's honey Holes for Mule Deer. This hunt is specifically designed for the group of DIY hunters, and since it has been a 100% success we are going to add semi-guided to the package to show you the property, fence lines, where the lodging is located and so on.

The hunt is off the beaten path by Molina, Colorado, South West of Grand Junction just over the edge of the flattops where the deer like it, migrate into, and of course you are hunting the 3rd season rut in it.

The first $\frac{1}{2}$ of the 3rd season is \$ 3500 discounted down to only \$ 2195 plus the \$ 2000 voucher discounted down to only \$ 800 voucher and has 4 hunters.

The second ½ of the 3rd season is \$ 3000 discounted down to only \$ 1395 plus the \$ 2000 voucher discounted down to only \$ 800 voucher and has 2 hunters.

The Colorado Deer License to the state is

Deer	\$ 34 Resident	\$ 379 Non-Resident

Wednesday is a transition day between 1st and 2nd half of the season; the first group needs to be out and off the property in the morning by 10 am for cleaning. The 2nd group can't come in until after 2 PM.

Hunting area Details

You will be hunting in GMU421 on Private land and have access to BLM and National Forest. The property breaks down as follows, 2,500 acres of private land with 1,300 acres of hayfield, oak brush and cedars. The Elevation is around 6,000 to 7,500 feet. There is another 1,000 acres is native grass, oak brush, aspens and dark spruce country. It connects to BLM and National Forest. The elevation there is around 7,500 to 10,000 feet.

This provides you the altitude from 6000 feet to 10.000 feet so the deer are always there. So, no matter where the deer are during the 3^{rd} season you will find them.

Normally up to 170's is taken but because a non-guided hunt has more to do with the hunter's skills vs the deer density it all comes down to your skills. I hear many hunters that want to hunt good private land in a DIY hunt. This is it. We have selected the best season, you will be hunting in **GMU421.**


Third season is a good season for everything. The mule deer are migrating and in the rut with this prime deer land having deer going in every direction from feed to cover to doe pockets. In the meantime, elk are not always on the property like the deer but they do move in and out of it during the year. During the 3rd season the elk are migrating everywhere so it is common to see them at any time on the property and every year as Colorado's elk population grows it is even more common to see them.

The catalyst that just kicks everything in high gear is a weather change, it forces them to move to adjust to their needs with the weather change. Also with the extreme variance in the altitude it can be snowing at 10,000 feet while it is sunny at 6000 feet.

You will need a 3rd season Deer license for this hunt. This is most likely a 1 year only hunt, so if you don't do it this year it most likely won't be available next year.

If elk are on the property you can hunt them also with no extra charge. A elk license can be picked up before opening day locally. Once the season begins you can get a license in Grand Junction.

The lodge is about 15 minutes away from the hunting grounds. You will need to do your own cooking.



Archery Season Go in on Sunday and come out on a Saturday (Break between 2 groups)

5 day hunt with 1 day (Saturday) in and 1 day (Sunday) out (season start 8/26)

Season Dates are as follows:

1st week 08/26-09/02 Archery*

2st Week 09/03-09/09 Archery

3nd week 09/10-09/16 Muzzleloader/Archery

4th week 09/17-09/24 Archery*

• Note: Because season dates and the days of the week don't align perfectly so the First week has a 1 day earlier and the last week has 1 extra day on the end.
