We are available for the hunter(s) that want to reach the back country and be successful. We offer archery, black powder and rifle hunts. Our goal is to provide a safe and enjoyable hunt. We pride ourselves on our hospitality, great food, and comfortable lodgings. We go the extra mile to help you have a great experience. We are proud to have very experienced, competent guides for our guided hunts. Our hunts go from ranch property pastures to Scrub oak valleys to Aspen parks to high country big timber. My apologies for the lack of very many slots opening each year, it is because our return client numbers are so high it leaves very few openings but we do have a few every year.

We offer hunts in the high country of unit **GMU421**, under special use permit on the Grand Mesa National Forest. This area is known for its good population of Elk, with extremely high bull to cow ratio. It is also abundant in Mule Deer, with several good bucks taken each year. Base camp is accessible by four-wheel drive. Hunting will be on foot, horseback, and some A.T.V. Our tent camps are very comfortable with cots, foam pads & wood stoves.

We also offer hunts in the lower country of **GMU411** and **GMU052**. These elk and mule deer hunts are offered for the combination rifle seasons, on public and private land. These areas are great for elk as it is their winter country. Mule deer hunts in these areas are considered trophy hunts as it is not uncommon for 180" to 200" to be harvested, even on public land. With these hunts we have access to a few private land vouchers for mule deer, every year. Elevation on these hunts ranges from 6000' to 8000'.

With just under 25 years of guiding experience alone this outfitter is not foreign on finding deer and elk. As he was guiding and growing up he was fortunate enough to guide for some of the best outfitters in

the business and have them as mentor attributing to his growth. Growing up in this area provides him with a large base of knowledge on how to be successful at finding the game you are after.

# **Hunting Seasons – Rates**

1. This is Mountain Cabin and 200 acres of private property that has 4 wheel drive up access on a private road. Behind the 200 acres is the back side of roadless national forest. The elk are in this area and more even move in to the area as national forest hunters from the other side work the area far below. When they hit the roadless area it stops the hunters, but the elk come through it like using a sign to let the elk in and keep the hunters out. The cabin is located so that you can drive the private land roads but the national forest is roadless and the elk have learned that this back side haven is the place to be when bunting seasons arrive. Many times, the lead cow is 10-12 years old, or seasons old, and she learned from her predecessors where to go to survive the hunting seasons so she takes he herd every year here for the safety of very limited hunting. You will be hunting in GMU062.

Pricing is \$9980 discounted down to only \$6780 Group Price = \$1695/person if 4 hunters max.

This hunt and camp requires 4 hunters or the equivalent payment for 4 hunters or less.

2. This is an 800 acres of private land tent camp backing up to National Forest with no roads. The private land has roads but the National Forest does not so again the other hunters from the bottom of the national forest never get to you or into the roadless part of this national forest. The match of the two provide a high volume of elk opportunity with last year providing a high hunter success rate. The 800 acres is some of the highest quality prime elk country in the area and the elk know it. This area has locals and migratory elk on it depending on the season you are hunting. You will be hunting in GMU 071.

Pricing is \$9980 discounted down to only \$6780 Group Price = \$1695/person if 4 hunters max.

This hunt and camp requires 4 hunters or the equivalent payment for 4 hunters or less.

(2<sup>nd</sup> Season) 5 day hunts - \$1495 DIY Drop Camp hunt - group of 4 min. Deer is draw only, Elk OTC. Rifle Bear hunts are included in all hunt prices except a \$500 kill fee for bears harvested and tag cost. We like bears shot, even though our horses don't. So as a compromise we don't charge for guiding you if we happen on bear but we do charge a harvest fee.

Rifle Deer hunts by draw only, some limited landowner vouchers may be available at hunters cost.

Rifle Bear hunts are included in all hunt prices except a \$500 kill fee for bears harvested and tag cost. Keep in mind bears are seldom seen during 3rd but common during the 1 season. The 2<sup>nd</sup> season is when they are beginning to go into hibernation due to lack of a food supply. Cold weather usually means their food supply has diminished to the point that hibernation is imperative. Warm weather can find the bears food supply available and them out gorging themselves in preparation for hibernation.
