The word is out Quebec has announced that this is the last year(1993) that hunters of the famous Leaf River herd in Quebec will be able to bag 2 bull Caribou. This has been the trend as the years have passed across Canada. Outside of Canada 1 per person per year has been the standard ever since I can remember.

I personally have faced a number of challenges with this herd in the past but the straw that broke the camel's back was broken when the artic wolves caught the cows in their calving grounds in the spring of 2011 and killed without eating 80% of the calves plus numerous cows in a fury of blood. Quebec quickly stopped the two caribou either sex that fall. In addition they made a last minute decision to make the 2011 season bull's only which irritated the meat hunters but the late season hunters were faced with bulls dropping their antlers before, during and after the season.

Well the Canadian Knife is going to drop again. The hunting season of September and October of 2013 will be the last time hunters will be able to take two caribou each. Add to this that the price for the transportation and the hunt will now be any lower for 2014 and you can only take 1 bull caribou.

The bottom line is if you every wanted to hunt caribou, or had a "Bucket List" with a caribou in it this is the year to go.

We have found some great pricing for the last year blow out and of course only have limited seating because of the number of hunters that has said it is either now or never!

The outfitter operates out of Nunavik, Quebec Canada hunting the famous Leaf River herd which means fantastic caribou hunting and great fishing throughout the immense tundra regions of northern Quebec. With over a decade of service for caribou, bear, ptarmigan and fishing they have invested heavily to provide a first class destination to caribou hunters and sport fishermen. With the goal of delivering a high quality adventure, camps and equipment are second to none in the industry. Fully integrated with its own fleet of float aircraft through is now one of the premier outfitters of northern Quebec. The importance of size and air transportation cannot be over stressed since caribou are a moving target, and satellite herd locations are extremely important to taking large caribou.

There are no roads in the tundra so the transportation is limited.

To best serve our clients, and keeping with our objective of delivering a first class caribou hunt or fishing trip, we have decided to keep our operation modest and focus on quality as an outfitting business. We want to get to know you personally and make sure that you are having a productive stay with us.

Quebec Labrador caribou are divided into 2 main herds. Both caribou herds migrate throughout our territories. The herds fluctuate from time to time and that is why, as an outfitter, we have to be able to redirect our operations to insure a successful season. The world record for Boone and Crockett caribou was taken out of the George River Herd in 1949 and still stands today as the number one bull ever taken. From a population decline experienced in 2007 The George River herd will need to be left alone for a while even though animals harvested during our last season in that area from that herd were in exceptional health and in great shape... Some think that elements from the George River Caribou herd simply migrated north for a while... Various hunting sectors found in our western areas and west of our Northern base near Kuujuaq, enable us access to the other famous herd: the Leaf River herd. Taking into consideration the importance of hunter mobility and territorial requirements for our big game caribou hunters, we have recently acquired new camps and added them to our outfitting operation. With more camps and territory being covered, the total number of hunting camps we can now operate is 21. This extensive hunting territory now covers almost the entire migration pattern of both caribou herds. During your caribou hunt you may also decide to take a black bear. Black bear are incidental to the caribou hunt and help cap off a great hunt with us.

For the fisherman, Atlantic salmon, Trophy Brook Trout, Lake Trout, Northern Pike await you if you fill early or just want some great fishing. Whether you are a pure fly fisher looking for Atlantic salmon on a fly or a hunter looking to combine some trophy brook trout fishing with your hunting, our watershed has some of the finest fresh water fishing in North America.

Considered to be the second largest herd of migrating animals in the world, The Quebec Labrador caribou species can be found throughout the northern sectors of both Quebec and Labrador Canada. Numbering close to half a million head, they are comprised of two separate herds, the George River herd in the northeast of Quebec and Labrador and the Leaf River herd in the northwestern sectors of Quebec. The Quebec Labrador Caribou designation was created to enable a distinct species listing in the record books of both Boone and Crockett and Pope and Young. Safari Club International has also a listing for the Quebec Labrador trophy caribou. This is our main caribou herd of choice for the hunters for this upcoming season will be the Leaf River Herd.

Caribou are constantly on the move, the Quebec Labrador Caribou species is rarely sedentary and constantly migrating somewhere. Caribou migrations come in a variety of patterns and numbers of animals. Caribou movement can be spread out over hundreds of square miles of tundra and taiga. Caribou can be seen moving alone or in small sporadic herds heading towards some general direction. Caribou migrations can also form into massive herds that are comprised of thousands of animals migrating in numerous lines that are sometimes up to 25 miles in length. The speed of a migration can be awesome with herds sometimes covering thirty miles per day. The peak of the Quebec Labrador caribou migration is an incredible wildlife spectacle and is a very impressive sight for any sportsman. The lucky hunter can be defined as the person who has made the right decision to hunt with the right outfitter, and is in the right place at the right time.

Considering the migratory nature of caribou, the caribou hunter who does not have the ability to move into other hunting areas in the case of shifting caribou migrations quickly understands the importance of hunting with an outfitter that has numerous camps and access to their own float planes. Our 21 camps are positioned in strategically placed in Quebec and Labrador to intercept caribou migrations.

Government satellite tracking reports that indicate caribou herd movement are also added to any current bush pilot and outfitter reports. All this information helps give us a good idea of our course of action and the potential positioning of our caribou hunters. Once all the information on caribou movement has been gathered and qualified, we present our hunting options and suggestions to our hunters.

There are two options available to caribou hunters when the caribou don't want to cooperate:

Option (1) To move to another camp in another area right away from our float plane base upon arrival at our base. Some of these potential camps may not be as comfortable as the camp that had been originally selected when the hunt was booked. This change of camp selection starting from the main base and resulting aircraft charter cost is on us. We want you to have a hunt to remember!

Option (2) you may decide to go to the original camp that had been selected when you had booked the hunt and try hunting there. During your stay at that camp you also have the option of chartering one of our float planes to fly you within our territory for a day of hunting. Flying into another available camp for an overnight is also an option that may allow you more time to hunt on a fly out. The costs of airplane charters for any fly outs to other hunting areas, or moving from your originally selected camp is your responsibility.

It is our main goal to get you to the caribou comfortably and safely. Although our hunts have a very high success rate, No one can guarantee hunting results. We do however, have the staff and the equipment that many others do not have. We also adhere to the philosophy of fair chase. We guarantee to give you an honest effort and to do our best to make sure that you have a productive and satisfying hunt with us.

We know that not every hunter's focuses only on the hunting but want some luxury items also. To make this hunt as flexible as possible we have provided a number of package options.

#1. We begin with our Economical Caribou Hunting Package

The housekeeping hunting package has been developed for those hunters who want to save some money by contributing to the hunt and helping out with the camp chores. You have to plan for your own food and cooking. Your group will be supervised by a resident camp manager who will direct and contribute to your hunting efforts. The camps are fully equipped, well situated and offer a very secure stay in our northern environment. The caribou camps accommodate only 6 hunters per week which makes for a far more intimate setting and relaxing hunt with a smaller group of hunting buddies.

The outpost or satellite camps have been designed to provide functional accommodations for smaller groups that are staying for the week or have been flown in for a day or two of hunting. These housekeeping facilities offer fully equipped kitchens and common sleeping and gathering areas. They will keep you warm and dry with their wood or oil heating while offering you a secure stay with their solid construction. Satellite communications are available at every camp and our aircraft support the daily needs and security of everyone involved. With us you will have first class and success.

Whatever your dreams are, we can take you to where the caribou are migrating or where the fish are biting.

FIREARMS DECLARATION

To enter Canada, you will need a valid passport. It is also important that you make sure there is nothing in your past that may not allow you to cross into Canada such as a DWI conviction or any other criminal offense. Bringing a hunting rifle in Quebec is quite simple contrary to what some of you might think.

Caribou Hunting Adventure Checklist for hunters

In September, temperatures may vary from 4°C (40°F) to 10°C (50°F) during daytime, sometimes with a wind chill factor. After mid-September, there may be some snowfalls with wind or cold rain. Dress warmly and do not forget gloves and warm waterproof boots.

Transportation to the great George River Caribou Herds

Our VIP and trophy packages start from Montreal. You will fly on a jet flight to Kuujuaq. Your 737 jet flight with First Air will last approximately two hours. In Montreal, we provide a parking space with security service for your vehicle for the duration of your stay.

Once you arrive in Kuujuaq, we will either transfer you to Stewart Lake or have you board a Twin Otter to reach your camp or lodge (flight duration: 40 to 80 minutes, depending on destination).

Over the past 50 years means of transportation have changed tremendously in these northern regions. But one thing has remained the same: weather. It is still the main-and unpredictable-factor in a journey's schedule and it may cause delays on your arrival or departure... it is wise not to plan return flights in order to give yourself room to manoeuver in case of delays due to Mother Nature.

Operation Policies

RESERVATION POLICY

A non-refundable* deposit amounting to 30% is required to confirm a reservation. The balance is payable in full no less than 45 days before departure date. Reservations made less than 45 days before departure date will be fully payable immediately, by check, credit card or bank transfer. We can arrange for monthly payments (please inquire).

NEXT-YEAR BOOKING

We offer a 5% rebate to patrons reserving for the following year. Confirmation must be given within 30 days after your stay has ended to qualify for next-year booking. A 30% non-refundable* deposit is required to confirm your reservation.

*Although the deposit is non-refundable, it can be transferred to another person of your choice or be credited to a reservation for the subsequent year.

INFORMATION: WHAT TO DO WHEN ARRIVING IN MONTREAL

If arriving by plane, you must go to the WYNDHAM Montreal Airport - there is a complimentary airport shuttle every 15 minutes.

If you are driving you must either go to Brossard Hotel - 7365 Blvd Marie-Victorin - Brossard - Qc. J4W or to Dorval depending on the package you have purchased.

All luggage should be clearly identified. We strongly advise to also use a means of visual identification. We recommend that firearms, fishing rods, bows, cameras, and camcorders be transported in rigid casing. Hunters carrying black powder should notify us so we can make the necessary arrangements for its transportation.
