













Hunt ID: CO-ElkMDeerMoose-All-BYGRAN-COS-LENG

An elk hunter can't be at 100% if he sleeps in a cold tent and a squeaky cot with the flaps slapping in the wind. In fact in war that is one of the best ways to wear an enemy down, make it to where he can't sleep. Needless to say this isn't war we out enjoying the pursuit of a magnificent animal, the bull elk known across the land for his intelligence and knowledge of what is in his environment. Also of course he is known as a trophy not easily outsmarted but pursed by hundreds of thousands of hunters each year because of his trophy value.

You need to be at 100% when you go out in the morning darkness to be just at the right point when the first rays of light appear. You first shot may be your last or only shot it can all be the same so it must be a good one.

This is why we offer a warm chalet style cabin for sleeping and relaxing after you have your license wrapped around the shin bone of a 6x6 bull that is hanging on the game pole.

The cabin is on 160 acres of private land, Way back in blocked from other hunters by their lack of access. The bright green meadow is wrapped in spruce, pines and aspens that are surrounded by miles and miles of the Arapahoe National forest. You will be the only one back there besides the elk that naturally

stay there called locals and those that pass through this time of the year. You will be hunting in GMU028 with the 1st elk a draw with 100% successes if you put in for a license and usually a few are left over. The 4th season is the same. The 2nd and 3rd season are bulls over the counter. (Extra cows can be taken with a cow license, also a buck deer license.)

Add to this you are back in 2.5 miles from a trail head and it is a number of miles from any paved roads. The outfitter will see that you get back into the property personally. The area is blessed with a non-motorized restriction on it but he and the owner have an easement for minimal vehicle travel.

If you add this up it spells ELK and DEER! Anyone other hunters, if you ever see one is lost and had to walk in at least 2.5 miles just to begin his hunt. We work hard to keep other from being in the area and let the elk feel safe as possible in this area for your enjoyment. The outfitter will take you in the day before the season and bring you out the day after your season. Elk and deer feel as though they are a long way from civilization and that makes the hunting very good. Your first hauling of you and your gear in and the hauling of everything out from the cabin is free with your hunt. If you need to or want to come in or out any time during your week we have to have the owner do it and he charges \$ 200 and must have advance notice. As you can see we cherish the Non-motorized vehicle restriction as a way to put you in the best hunting and the warm cabin lodging. We only have opening when one of our groups gets too old to hunt otherwise it is booked a year in advance. Contact me as soon as possible and I will advise what is available.

It is a great hunting from the cabin and all the area around it. At the Cabin you will find all the creature comforts, including solar generated electricity, hot and cold running water, an indoor toilet, a shower and space for you and eleven of your friends to sleep.

The three story cabin has a wood stove, firewood, running water with an indoor flush toilet, a shower, hot and cold running water, solar electricity, games, mattresses, pillows and kitchen utensils (pots, pans and settings for twelve). You provide....sleeping bags and food!

The basement of the Cabin has a wood stove and plenty of firewood. The main floor consists of a kitchen, dining area, bathroom, guitar, CD player and a small sleeping area. There are two bedrooms in the loft.

The Cabin is tucked away 2.5 miles back in the forest between the towns of Fraser and Tabernash, near Meadow Creek Reservoir, about 65 miles west of Denver and 15 minutes west of Winter Park to give you a high level ball park view of where you will be hunting.

There are a few deer but the winters and the elk have made them few and far between. When you see a deer they are good ones, just not a lot of them.

The meadow is a favorite feeding area for the elk then they move up into the timbered slopes or day time bedding. The aspen draws are a favorite for elk at any time it is their cover and food source.

Pricing is as scheduled and as follows for Cabin DIY Hunt:

The first for hunters split \$ 10,000 discounted down to only \$ 6000 base fee, \$ 1500 each.

Bring your hunting buddies and per buddy it is \$ 1500 reduced down to only \$1000 each.

The cabin will sleep 12 but we try to keep it to 10 or less.

When you get a deer or elk the outfitter will pack it out for you is you request. You will need to get the animal where the outfitters horse can get to it and get out of the area with a full pack load. The price for the pack out to get the elk to camp is \$500 reduced to only \$195 for our hunters.

Archery 4th Week, The last 6 days of the season which are the prime weeks for bugling of the archer season.

There are late cow seasons at a reduced rate because they are cow elk hunts only but many times they are left over after the draw. Keep in mind you can have 2 elk licenses every year but 1 must be a private land cow license with a P Hunt code. The private land is only 160 acres of thousands of acres of National Forest.

You are free to bring wives and guests to share the Colorado Mountains and hunting experience with them but they will count the same as a hunter.
