Come hunt the center of the world with me. I pursue Mule Deer, Whitetail Deer, Antelope, Coyotes, Rabbits, Prairie dogs, Waterfowl, doves and more. My location gains me access to thousands of acres of private land. I have hunted here all of my life and know my way around and the landowners that I hunt on.

We hunt Colorado's eastern plains, because it offers affordable hunts, and not just trophy big game hunting. Perfect for folks who want to have a good time, get away from "it all" and HUNT. We are more than just a hunting outfitter. Three generations of ranching in south eastern Colorado give an extensive agriculture to add to my wildlife background which is so important when it comes to hunting or even more important finding game on the days that nature and weather plan for you to have a bad day.

Our hunting location is in what some deem, " The Middle of Nowhere" which is how I like it for hunting, secluded, isolated, but easy to get to, and for a lot of hunters, we are right on the way. We have great weather for shooting, and we offer an everyman's style hunt, where a hunter can fire his gun a lot, everyone in the party will get to shoot, and everyone has a good time. We are affordable, and we most likely have a little something for everyone.

### **Deer Hunts and Trophy Deer Hunts**

Much of the land out here I have leased which strictly make up my cost of hunting. The areas where I get trophy deer are more expensive to lease and my cost per deer is higher. My hunt prices reflect that.

I have a lot of other deer areas that have plenty of deer but the average size may be smaller on the average and the price reflects that also. We pass that discounted cost on to the hunter because we believe in making these haunt available and affordable to the working man. In either location the hunt will be enjoyable and we will see deer it is all about the quality level in area vs the other. We recommend that everyone sight their rifle in dead on for 200 yards and practice shooting at 200 yards, also at 300 if possible. If you shoot at 300 yards than a 200 yard shot would be a slam dunk. The farther you can shoot quickly and accurately the better you're odd of filling your license. These hunts are providing you the opportunity of checking your rifle when you get here and shooting 200 and 300 yards with steel to quickly confirm a hit at 300 yards since most spotting scopes are marginal as to be able to see bullet holes at 300 yards. This country is open and distances are long the best insurance you have is to practice long shots lying down.

**Pronghorn Antelope Hunting**

Pronghorn are exciting to hunt and can be a thrill for even the most accomplished hunter. Doe pronghorn also offer youth hunters a great opportunity to have a fulfilling outdoor experience. We challenge antelope Muzzleloader hunters to hunt with us using spot and stalk methods instead of ground blinds by the water hole. We will be hunting where our antelope numbers are the highest in GMU126. We can customize any hunt to meet your specifications!

Note: You can draw a Muzzleloader Antelope with zero points even after putting in for a antelope point as your 1<sup>st</sup> choice. If you need help with the application let me know.

Additional days can be added to any hunt, if available, for \$350 per day. This includes in-field transportation and meals and lodging.

The Colorado eastern plains can be difficult to get big game license. Most of our hunting is in GMU126 by the town of Eads off of highway 287 about 40 minutes north of Lamar.

We do have some vouchers on some years but they sell out quickly.

Note: Whitetail only rifle tags combine all three hunting units. Archery and muzzleloader tags are also combined hunt codes. What this means is triple the hunting area, thus increasing the quality of your hunt. It also allows for multiple hunting locations and increased numbers of game to select from.

### **British Pheasant, Quail or Chukar Hunt**

This hunt is more of a fly by rather than a jump shoots with dogs to begin with, following the British style of pass shooting upland game birds instead of flushing them with a good dog. Fast paced shooting challenge, that is fun for parties of 2 - 10. Test your skills on these hard to shoot birds!! Each person will enjoy awesome, fast paced shooting from the 5 stations. See who is the master marksmen of your group as the birds come exploding out in front of you. But wait when the pass shooting is over many birds are

usually missed. And escape into the grassy undergrowth. For those we get the dogs out and do an American upland Game Bird hunt with dog work, flushes of pheasants, chucker and quail with retrieving by the dog(s). If you would like to bring your own dog you are welcome to and use mine as an assist or just use yours. It is your hunt you define the players.

We are under a special license that means a hunting license is not needed to hunt pheasant. We stock commercially raised, flight conditioned birds. They are hunted under natural conditions on a working milo farm. You will need a dog or can hunt with ours. This is not a canned hunt. You are not guaranteed to get any pheasant. Birds are NOT guaranteed to be in the area you are hunting. There is a good chance of success. Also, you can legally shoot hen pheasant you see. You can hope to successfully harvest 2-4 pheasant each with a limit of 6 pheasant each.

A relaxing afternoon shooting ducks and doves on the ranch ponds is hard to beat!

### **Morning Doves**

Dove hunting is lots of fun and is a great way to build on your shooting skills. While we do not have dove numbers to compare with Argentina there is still lots of shooting action to be enjoyed. The action can at times be so intense that the memories made can last a life time. With a decent state bag limit of 15, plenty of rounds will be fired. With a great setting around the pond at the ranch you will enjoy a quality, authentic mourning dove hunt. After the hunt you can enjoy your harvest at the lodge (grilled, bacon wrapped dove breast, YUM)

### **Lodging**

In the middle of nowhere lodging is always an issue. In town the motel is \$85 per night.

I have provided a bunkhouse for lodging for \$45 per night per person if available.

The bunkhouse is approximately 900 square feet in size with 2 private rooms with queen beds, a common room with 2 single beds, kitchen, shower, laundry private parking, and gas grill. Beds are complete with furnishings. Kitchen is complete with microwave, stove, fridge/freezer, dishes, and silverware. There is not cable or wi-fi we encourage you to spend your time either in the field or enjoying the peace and quiet of the rural community. There is off street parking and you are sure to find things ready for you. You're only a few blocks from the grocery store and gas station. There is a place to hang game as well.

### **Rabbit Hunting Jacks and Cottontails**

Rabbit hunting is an affordable and fun way to get outside and hunt. With multiple ways to hunt it is most likely just right for you. Rabbit hunting is great for the veteran hunter who wants to relive the game that started it all or a person that needs to get started. What to expect: We have huge jackrabbits. They get bigger than your cat or small dog. Jackrabbits can be flushed and taken with a shotgun. We

also have cottontail rabbits that are "normal" in size. Cottontail rabbits are normally found around old homesteads and are active early in the morning.

Firearms: Anything, shotguns work great for close range but rimfire rifles are the most effective.

Centerfire rifles are great as the rabbits will often run several hundred yards before stopping to present a shot. We will try to hunt in a manner that works well with your firearm.

**Prairie Dog Hunting Season May through August**

We reserve the right to make any changes necessary. These changes may include but are not limited to closure, relocation, adjustment of terms, price increase or cancelation. Prairie Dogs as we use them are a resource. In many areas they can be considered varmints. Good prairie Dog management is to not wipe out a prairie dog town but to harvest a given percentage every year then allow them to reproduce to make up that loss the following year. To do that you must not shoot the prairie dog town until you have visual confirmation that the mound of the year are born, out of the hole, and Self-sufficient. If the town is shot before that or a female early you can set back a prairie dog town years with very little recreational shooting.

**Gun Range**

Check your guns after the long trip at our shooting range. There you will find permanent tables accommodating enthusiast of both hand preference. Target backs that accept most standard sizes of targets are positioned at 100 and 200 yards. There is also a half circle pistol range. Here you can enjoy shooting targets such as water bottles with your favorite handgun. We also have a basic clay pigeon thrower for honing in your shotgun skills for that wing shooting hunt! There are range distances of 100, 200, 300 and 400 yards. There is also a place to shoot your favorite pistol.

Ranges days are 4 hours and cost \$20 per person, shooting or not. Includes 3 targets or 25 clays  
Use of the range is complimentary with all other hunting options.
