





Hunt ID: TX-Aoudad-All-ASDALL-HH-ONNIER

Trophy Class 30+ Inch Aoudad or Barbary sheep if you would rather call them, the wildest member of the sheep family, and also the best camouflaged for the red rocks and soil of North Texas. Good eye sight, ears, nose and wild sense to keep you in one canyon while they are in another. This is a rugged terrain hunt all walking and climbing with the core are about 400 large private acres if measured flat. A full three day hunt awaits hunters with the stamina, and a discounted price.

There are 7 canyons on the property, with 3 water tanks with thick Oak brush, Cedar, overgrown mesquite and rock, rocks, and more rocks. At times they will bait in with hay and oats but it is the exception not the rule. Most likely the ones coming in are the young and the females, the big rams stay in the most rugged country that they can find. The 3 day hunt is fully guided and a jeep and ATV will be furnished if needed but most of it is just boot leather hunting.

The standard successful hunt is spot and stalk with the one on one and only guide that has years of field judging and handling these 250 pound plus rams and hunting this area. The guide will field judge the horns to the best of his ability to tell you his estimated size so you can decide which one you want to hunt. This is a 1 on 1 hunt unless you decide two or 3 people want to hunt together than it can be expanded, with possible price concessions.

Since you are hunting rams only these can be hunted year around if the maximum of 6 per calendar year has not been reached. This quality control allows 6 rams every year to make the 30" criteria at 8-9 years of age. Hunting opportunity has been 99.9% and so has the harvest and will stay that way as long as hunters continue to shoot well. You will want a 270 or larger rifle sighted in dead on at 200 yards, anticipating possible shots across canyon walls at up to 250 yards. Another good item required to bring is a pair binocular because this kind of spot and stalk hunting requires a lot of move, and glass to be certain that you spot the rams before they spot you. Then stalking can be difficult in the rugged canyon lands.

The degree of exertion can be level 1 if they come to the bait but more often than not the spot and stalk hunt can be as high as a level 3 at times.

Meals and lodging is not included in this hunt but there are 2 towns 10 miles away that can provide reasonable motel lodging for your hunt. Those towns are Glenrose and Cleburne, Texas and with self-contained travel trailer or tents hunters can camp self-contained on the property.

Skinning, caping, and meat processing is not included but all could be handled at those same town or 50 miles away in Dallas.

The only license required is a Texas hunting license for exotics at about \$50 for a non-resident.

Hunters can fly into Dallas/Ft Worth Airport, rent a car drive 1 ½ hours to ranch.

The outfitter will contact you to schedule a date or answer any questions once he receives your deposit and contact information.

This guided Trophy Aoudad hunt was priced at \$3995 but since 6 rams need to be taken to balance the herd the first 3 will be discounted down to only \$2995. Don't miss your opportunity to get one of these big rams at the discounted price.

Note: All licenses are available 24 hours at Wal-Mart or Sporting Goods stores.

Texas basically has the lowest hunting license price in the nation! For a \$315 over the counter deer license you can shoot up to 5 deer, 1 Javelina, unlimited hogs, a couple of turkey, exotic animals, varmints, with a rifle, bow or shotgun and upland game birds... and I probably forgot some it is so inclusive. The exotic license is only \$50 and can be all the license you need for Aoudads.

The 5 deer can be broken down into 2 does and 3 bucks depending on what counties you are hunting and if they are a 1 buck or a 2 buck county. You can use one but no more than 1 of the buck tags for your Mule Deer Buck. Bottom line is that it is a license to kill and I have gone home with 5 deer, a Javelina, 2 hogs, and 4 rams all on one trip.
