When Hunting in Montana, why not chose one of the Montana's best Hunting Outfitters? We have been in business for over 18 years; specializing in mule deer, whitetail deer, elk, antelope, turkey, upland birds, varmints, black bear and mountain lion. Hunts for the rifleman, muzzleloader and archery enthusiast, hunts are located in Eastern Montana and western North Dakota, our fair chase hunts take

place on private property in Montana and North Dakota as well as the Lewis and Clark National Forest in central Montana. The hunting camps vary from wall tents, to camper trailers, to cabins to our home base lodge in some of the best-known deer country in Montana, the Powder River Breaks, the Milk River, and the Yellowstone River drainages. We offer you a high percentage of success in taking that fine trophy animal you have always sought after, and even a higher chance of having an adventure of a lifetime!

If drawing is a problem Montana has come up with a \$995 fee that will allow you to bypass the draw and purchase the license, much like a landowner voucher is used in other states.

Deer Hunts

Archery Deer

This is an excellent hunt for the bow hunter enthusiast to take part in. We offer both archery mule deer as well as archery whitetail hunts. With the help of pre-season scouting and some of the best deer country in Eastern Montana, we pattern our deer to and from their bedding and feeding areas, thus enabling us with the aid of pits, tree stands, ground blinds, decoys and/or stalking to get you within range. Quite often we will see three or more mature bucks traveling together during bow season. The whitetail hunts are conducted along the river bottoms with Ag fields. The mule deer hunts are done in the hills, badlands and canyons doing spot and stalk hunting.

Rifle Deer and Antelope combination hunts

this is a great first time hunt with lots of action and high success for both species. This hunt is very similar to our Mule Deer and Antelope hunts except we combine the two together for a very affordable hunt. This is your opportunity to take two North American Big Game animals in one trip. Our success rate runs 95-100% on deer between 18 to 24 inches and antelope 12 to 14 inches.

Rifle Mule Deer

Our Mule Deer hunts take place on very large private ranches. The terrain varies from dry, rolling grasslands up to rough canyons with cuts and pockets of brush and trees. There are also open fields of grain and meadows of hay leading up to patchy and heavy pine and cedar trees providing cover for the deer during hot fall afternoons. On this hunt you will often see 20 to 50 deer daily. Success rate is over 95% with the outside spread on the antlers between 20-28 inches with 22-26 being about average.

Rifle Whitetail

Our Whitetail deer hunts take place on some of Eastern Montana's finest whitetail country. The land is characterized by river bottoms with large hay and grain fields leading up to dry, rough, rolling grasslands with broken patches of trees and brush spread throughout the hills. We hunt such rivers as the Yellowstone River, Milk River, Tongue River, Powder River, Missouri River, Little Missouri River and Musselshell River. The best time to hunt our big bucks is during the November rut. Thus enabling us to use our binoculars to locate your buck and then stalking to within range or jumping the deer from a bedded area. Success is high for bucks with 16-22 inch outside spreads, scoring 120-160 B.C. points. This hunt is a great chance to get that trophy whitetail of a lifetime

Montana Trophy Deer

In addition to the antelope, mule deer and whitetail hunts offered on over 150,000 acres of private property, we will also offer a very limited number of TROPHY EXCLUSIVE HUNTS. These hunts take place on ranches that allow no other hunting and are managed for BIG deer only. Whitetails will be in the 150"-185" class and mule deer in the 160"-205" class. Limited Hunters (guaranteed licenses available). If your trophy room is in need of something a little more than average, take a look at these hunts. Each ranch offers something different, so look them over close and get in contact with us for availability and rates. Again, we take a very limited number of clients on these ranches, so do not hesitate to book early, they will go quickly.

Pronghorn Antelope Rifle and Archery

Archery

A true western classic! This is an excellent hunt for the bow hunter of all ages to take part in. During archery season we do most of the hunting from ground blinds placed at waterholes. The shot distances will be 35-60 yards. We do decoying and stalking to bring the mature herd bucks in close enough for a good shot. Often during the rut a buck will come to within 10 yards or even attempt to run you and the decoy over. This can be one of the most exciting and unforgettable hunts you will ever encounter.

Rifle

Here is a western big game hunt that everyone must do at least once. The early October weather offers lots of fun and action at an affordable price. The country we hunt in Eastern Montana produces some of the largest horned antelope in the state. The average is just over 13 inches and bucks 15 and even over 16 inches have been taken every year. You will often see 50 to 100 antelope daily and success rate runs 97%-100% on these hunts.

Elk - Rifle and Archery Hunts

Elk hunts take place on the Lewis and Clark National Forest Lands as well as some bordering private ranches. The terrain varies from rolling hills, grasslands, creek bottoms to heavy timbered mountains with semi open parks. Hunting is done with the aid of 4×4 trucks, 4 wheelers and hiking. Archery elk season is in September with heavy timber, good populations of elk and the rut, high opportunities and success are available. We use tree stands along agricultural fields and trails the bulls are using during the rut with good opportunities. Rifle elk season is the last week of October and all of November. Bulls range from 5x5, to 6x6s in the 260-350 class.

Buffalo Hunts

We have partnered up with ranches in South Dakota and Montana to offer some exciting Buffalo Hunts. This is an exciting 1-2 day hunt for "trophy", 5 year old + bulls. You will stay at the 8,500 acre ranches, which supports a herd of almost 500 buffalo year round. The hunter will receive the meat, hide, head and horns of the Buffalo. Cow hunts, meat bull hunts and trophy bull hunts are available. All animals taken from the ranch will be delivered to a local processing facility. The hunter is responsible for all

meat processing charges and taxidermy work. Please reserve your hunts early. Best time to hunt is September through February when the hides are in great condition.

Mountain Lion Hunts

Hunts take place on the Lewis and Clark National Forest Lands as well as some bordering private ranches. Season is December 1 - February 15 and August 31 is the deadline for the license application. Excellent populations of lion with high success with the aid of dogs, snow shoes and snow machines. This can be a physical hunt.

Black Bear Hunts

Hunts take place on the Lewis and Clark National Forest Lands as well as some bordering private ranches. Season is Mid April - May 31 with April 14 being the deadline for license applications. We have excellent populations of bear with high hunter success by spot and stalk hunting. NO use of dogs or baiting permitted in Montana.

Merriam Turkey Hunts

Eastern Montana Merriam Turkey hunts on private land. Spring season (mid April through mid May) offers a two bird limit. Fall season (September through December 15) offers a one bird limit. Lodging is in a cabin with hot showers and three meals served daily. We can take a maximum of 8 hunters at a time. Our hunts are semi-guided to fully guided, helping you to a successful hunt. Over the counter licenses are when available for purchase when you arrive in Montana. This is truly a "Gobbler Hunt" you do not want to miss with 100s of bird's scene daily.

Rates include

Private and/or Public hunting property; all lodging and meals; Capes and hides properly cared for; Vehicles provided for hunting. You are responsible for: Your license cost; your personal gear; all transportation costs to hunting area (airfare, car rental etc.); Taxidermy services; all meat processing. Tipping: Gratuities are not included in the price of the hunt and they are not required. However, you are strongly encouraged to tip your guides and your cook. Since we are asked all the time what to tip we recommend \$100 - \$200 per hunter for your guide and \$30-\$50 per hunter for your cook. Their job is to take good care of you so we ask you to do the same.

Refund Policy

Refunds on deposits are only given if a license is not drawn, and there are no "over the counter", or "left over" licenses available to purchase. Either for the species you are hunting or a combination license containing the species you are hunting. Please keep in mind these "over the counter" or "left over" licenses may cost extra to purchase than your original application fee. EXAMPLE: You apply for the "Deer Combination License", you do not draw the license, but there are "Big Game Combination" licenses available to purchase over the counter, you are required to purchase this license, even if it is of higher price for the license.

License Information

Non-resident deer and elk license drawing due March 15th. Guaranteed archery antelope licenses. For Montana License Applications; Information; (406) 444-2950 Montana deer and elk licenses are sold out by MARCH 15 and antelope by JUNE 1. Deer and elk applications will be available about JANUARY 15 and antelope licenses about APRIL 15. Mountain Lion applications are due August 31. Mountain Lion Trophy licenses must be purchased after the mountain lion kill. Black Bear applications for spring season only are due April 14. Licenses may be purchased after April 14th but are valid only in the fall season. No bear license may be purchased after August 31. Hunters must show proof of having passed a black bear identification test before purchasing a license. Bow and Arrow License and Bowhunter Education. A bow and arrow license, plus the proper hunting license is required during: (1) the deer, elk, and/or antelope Archery Only Season; or (2) to archery hunt in an Arch-Equip only area or hunting district. To purchase a Montana bow and arrow license, a hunter must:* Provide a certificate of completing the National Bow hunter Education Foundation course, or* Provide any prior year bow hunting/archery stamp, tag, permit, or license from any state or province.

FAQ

Frequently Asked Questions

When do we arrive at and depart from camp?

On all our hunts we ask our clients to arrive after 3:00pm the day before your hunt. Departure will be the evening of the last day of your hunt or the following morning.

What is your ratio of guides to hunters?

All hunts are priced at two (2) or three (3) hunters per guide. 1 x 1 hunts are available for an additional fee

What happens if I do not draw the antelope tag on my combination hunt? Combination hunters NOT drawing antelope licenses are still obligated for the deer hunt on the original dates booked.

Where do I fly/drive to for camp?

We operate multiple camps in 2 states. When flying, please contact outfitter to determine which airport is closest to the camp in which you will be hunting. The 3 airports most commonly used are Billings MT, Bismarck ND and Rapid City SD. You will most likely fly into one of these three airports, rent a 4 wheel drive vehicle and drive approximately 2 to 3 hours to your hunting destination.

What is your wound policy?

Any hunter drawing blood and/or wounding any animal will be finished hunting. Our guarantee and obligations for your hunt fees are completed at that time. Any hunter not informing us of a shot taken, a shot missed, or a possibly wounded or dead animal will be ejected from camp after dealing with the Montana State Game Warden for wanton waste of a big game animal. We WILL make every effort to retrieve and find any wounded animal. Any hunter wounding an animal will be allowed to pay one-half of brochure prices of the hunt to continue hunting. This will be only after an exhaustive search for the wounded animal not found. If this happens two times, your hunt is completed.

Are deposits refundable?

No. Deposits are non-refundable. Here is a short explanation of why we must enforce this policy. After you have made a reservation and sent us your deposit, we are no longer able to market that hunt. We turn away numerous hunting parties every year because we are fully booked. When we turn these parties away, they go to other services and make alternate hunting arrangements. If you cancel your hunt, we will not have the opportunity to sell this hunt to any of these other parties. We understand your hunt is a vacation for you, but please understand that all of our employees depend upon the revenue earned from the hunting season for our livelihood.

Refund Policy

Refunds on deposits are only given if a license is not drawn, and there are no "over the counter", or "left over" licenses available to purchase. Either for the species you are hunting or a combination license containing the species you are hunting. Are gratuities included in the price of the hunt?

No. Gratuities are not included and they are not required. However, you are strongly encouraged to tip your guides and your cook. We recommend \$100 - \$200 per hunter for your guide and \$30-\$50 per hunter for your cook. Their job is to take good care of you so we ask you to do the same.

Are there special requirements for archery?

Yes. A bow and arrow license, plus the proper hunting license is required during: (1) the deer, elk and /or antelope Archery Only Season; or (2) to archery hunt in an Arch-Equip only area or hunting district. To purchase a Montana bow and arrow license, a hunter must:

- * Provide a certificate of completing the National Bowhunter Education Foundation course or
- * Provide any prior year's bowhunting/archery stamp, tag, permit or license from any state or province.

How Tough Are Our Hunts?

On our hunts you will be staying right at the ranch house with us. You will have hot showers and eat home style meals with our family. For those wanting to stay closer to the night-life a newer local Motel is also close at hand for your use, with restaurants, bars and casinos available. The use of private property, 4-wheel drive trucks, preseason scouting, knowledgeable guides, plentiful game, and the kind of country we hunt, most of the hunts are not real physically demanding. We have guided clients in their teens to in their 70's and have had very good success. Anyone under 18 must submit proof verifying they have completed a safe handling firearms course. Anyone having special needs will be matched up with the right guide. The pace of the hunt will be geared to accommodate you on your western hunt.

What equipment should I bring?

Weather in MT is considerably variable so do your homework! Check the weather forecast for Wibaux MT and it should give you a good idea of the changing conditions. Warm coat (preferably wool), Light coat, Warm hat, Two (2) pairs warm gloves, Wool pants, Two (2) pairs wool socks, Plenty of cotton socks, Two (2) complete changes of clothes, Long underwear, Leather hunting boots, If the weather is cold and snowy you will want leather top Pac-boots (Schnee's type), Raincoat and rain pants or poncho, Warm sleeping bag (rated to -10F), Fanny pack and/or day pack, 400 square inches hunter orange,

Rifle/Bow, Two (2) boxes of shells/12 arrows, License, Watch, Binoculars, Knife, Two (2) small disposable flashlights, Camera and extra film, Rangefinder, Shooting sticks, Game bags

What Rifles & Optics do you recommend?

We recommend flat shooting calibers. .25-06, .270, 7mm, .300 for our deer and antelope hunts. Your rifle should be sighted in 1-2 inches high at 100 yards. A 4x or better scope is recommended for this is big country and shots can be long. Prepare yourself for shots 25 to 400 yards with a good average of about 250 yards. Please practice!! Sight in your gun and practice shooting FREE HAND, kneeling, sitting and prone before the trip, be comfortable shooting and KNOW YOUR GUN. Every year we see Trophy animals get away because of the hunter's shooting. Bring good quality binoculars. The country we hunt is very big and good binoculars can save you time and many miles of walking. A bipod is strongly recommended for this type of country.
