







Hunt ID: UT-NM-ElkMDeer-Lindon-BBGO-KM

If one is good, then 2 are better! Get not just 1 but two elk in one trip. We have the availability of getting "Spike Bull Tags" for one of the coveted trophy bull elk areas. Part of the management program the Utah Division of Wildlife Resources provides us with Spike elk vouchers and the availability to purchase licenses.

In addition you can put in for a cow elk license in the regular Utah limited license drawing which has an application begin and due date of 2/1 and due date of 4/24 of each year. Cow License applications begin on 6/1 and are due by 6/26.

Now we have a special 7 day October hunt packed in and living in Tent camps at a price of \$ 3500 reduced down to only **\$ 2495**, and if you have a license for a second elk then it is only \$595 more for the second elk.

One top of talking two elk you will be rubbing shoulders with some huge 360 class and larger bulls, kind of a look but don't touch hunt. It is a lot of fun and a good time to build your hunting skills so that in the future we can get you in a trophy area like this in September during the elk rut! During this hunt you will learn to estimate big bull size on the hoof a skill that is mandatory if you want to take a big bull instead of a ho-hum elk in the future.

This is a tent camp that is very comfortable. Each hunter gets their own 9'x 11' tent, with cot, mattress pad, propane heater and lantern. In some cases, we'll have two hunters in a 9'x 13' tent, when circumstances call for this situation. The tent camps are also equipped with a kitchen tent and a large dining tent. We have large outhouses built at our tent camp sites, along with a portable shower stall. Meals are cooked on site, by qualified camp cooks. Be sure and ask if you have any question about our camp life.

We also have 10 special vouchers for 10 Cow elk hunts. We will hunt then later in the season. We have the voucher and the hunt priced \$ 1800 reduced down to only **\$1195** and has had 100% success in the past. Lodging and meals are the responsibility of the hunter. If we get enough that don't want to drive to town we will work out something for an option of tent lodging where the hunt is located.

with a B&C trophy pronghorn antelope. We also have guaranteed tags for trophy Shiras moose. Come and let us put our 20 plus years of experience to work for you.

All of our hunting is trophy fair chase hunts that take place on large private ranches in Utah and New Mexico. Through the Utah cooperative wildlife management unit (CWMU) program we receive guaranteed landowner permits for bull elk, buck mule deer, pronghorn antelope, and Shiras Bull Moose.

These landowner tags are good for the private land to which the voucher is allocated. We offers fully guided one-on-one and two-on-one big game hunts for monster trophy mule deer bucks, huge Utah bull elk, New Mexico trophy bull elk, Boone and Crockett New Mexico antelope, and Utah Shiras moose.

Through the Utah CWMU private land hunting program we are able to conduct our Utah trophy bull elk hunts in September during the rut and bugle season, and because we hunt on quality private land leases with very little hunting pressure, our clients are provided with some of the most exciting rifle bull elk rut hunts in the western hunting world. Our trophy mule deer hunts are some of the best in the West, providing our clients with opportunities at some true monster muleys. Due to flexible CWMU dates, we offer velvet high country mule deer buck hunts as well as November mule deer rut hunts. For all you muley crazed nuts out there looking for a monster muley, give us a call about our trophy mule deer hunts.

Our New Mexico hunts have consistently produced Boone & Crockett (B&C) pronghorn antelope, including the second largest buck antelope ever taken in New Mexico. We also have guaranteed rifle Shiras moose permits through Utah's CWMU program. Our fully guided trophy Shiras moose hunts produce some great bulls including a few that have qualified for the Boone & Crockett awards.

TROPHY MULE DEER HUNTS

Trophy mule deer are our Passion! Over the past 25 years we have provided our clients with some of the best private land mule deer hunting in the western United States. We hunt these elusive animals on five different quality ranches, all of which are strictly managed to optimize the quantity of trophy caliber bucks. Some leases have steeper terrain making them more physical to hunt, some have thicker cover requiring a more patient hunter, but all of our ranches have exceptional mule deer habitat.

Depending on the ranch, our accommodations range from comfortable tent camps to nice lodges with all the modern amenities. Our hunts are generally five full days and guided on a one-on-one basis. Due to incredible genetics, selective harvest, and pre-scouting efforts by our guides our leases provide hunters with an excellent opportunity to harvest bucks scoring between 180 and 200 B&C points, with several bucks larger than this seen and taken every year.

Guaranteed permits – No drawings required! By obtaining landowner permits we are able to provide our clients with quality, fair chase, mountain terrain, trophy buck hunts without applying for tags through state drawing systems. Hunters who are in good physical condition and able to shoot at "western"

yardages greatly increase their chances of harvesting a trophy buck. We are booking these hunts one to two years in advance, so please call early for pricing and availability.

TROPHY ANTELOPE HUNTS

Guaranteed permits – no drawings required! We have two large private ranches in New Mexico on which we conduct our antelope hunts. Both properties have good antelope numbers, good buck to doe ratios, and very high hunter success on great quality bucks.

These New Mexico ranches are some of the very best trophy pronghorn hunts in the country, with numerous Boone & Crockett bucks produced every year! Both ranches are over 95,000 acres and are hunted on a very limited basis. This ensures that every year we are harvesting bucks in the right age class, which in turn gives our clients the best opportunity at that B&C trophy-of-a-life-time. We hunt out of either a comfortable ranch house or a 10,000 square foot lodge.

Our guides spend several days out of the year pre-season scouting to ensure our hunters the best chance at the biggest bucks on these ranches. All of our guides are very competent and have many years of experience guiding antelope hunts. These hunts are three full days and are typically guided one-on-one. We are currently booking these hunts one to two years in advance so please call early to secure your hunt.

Trophy Elk Hunts

There are few things in hunting more exhilarating than the bugle of a mature bull elk on a crisp September morning, and fortunately, due to flexible dates, we are able to hunt these magnificent animals during the peak of the rut with a rifle or any weapon. We have three large ranches on which we conduct our elk hunts, two of which are in Utah and one in New Mexico. Through these ranches we receive guaranteed, transferable permits, thus eliminating the hassle of state drawing systems for our clients. Each ranch is managed for high numbers of elk, high bull to cow ratios, and high hunter success. All of these hunts take place from mid-September to mid-October.

We have three price ranges which are based on the average Boone & Crockett score that each ranch produces on a consistent basis; however all of these ranches are capable of producing 350 class bulls. We have experienced over 95% success on all our elk leases for many years, with scores ranging from 250 to 415 Boone & Crockett points. We hunt out of either small cabin facilities or a nice ranch house. Our elk hunts are five days and are guided one-on-one or one-on-two depending on the ranch. Though we do have a high percentage of returning clients, we generally have a few openings at the beginning of each year. These hunts fill up fast so please call early to secure your hunt.

SHIRAS MOOSE HUNTS

Guaranteed permits – No drawings required! Obtaining a Shiras moose permit is very difficult these days. One either has to win the lottery through state drawing systems or purchase a landowner tag which can be very hard to come by. We feel very fortunate to get two or three permits every year that we can offer to our clients. Our moose hunts take place on quality ranches which are hunted on a very limited basis and consistently produce 40” to 45” bulls. We usually hunt in late September or early October during the rut when these docile animals are most active, thus ensuring our clients the best opportunity at a trophy bull. We hunt out of a cabin or lodge facility, both of which are nice and very comfortable. These hunts are generally five days and guided one-on-one. If you are interested in a quality Shiras moose hunt, give us call!

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Where does your hunting take place?

Our entire hunting takes place on tightly controlled, well managed private leases in Northern Utah and New Mexico.

Do you have guaranteed permits?

In the areas we hunt, licenses are guaranteed through private landowner permits in New Mexico and cooperative wildlife management units (CWMU) in Utah. Our private property permit applications are usually sent out to our clients by June 15. It is then up to the clients to return these applications to us with appropriate license fees, usually payable to the game and fish department of the state in which you are hunting. Hunter education is required for licensing if born after December 31, 1965.

When hunting with Bucks & Bulls what should I bring?

- Sleeping bag
- Towel and washcloth
- Personal items
- Rain gear
- Weather Appropriate Clothing
- Quality Hiking Boots (2 pairs)
- Rifle
- Binoculars
- Spotting Scope (optional)
- Camera
- Orange Vest and Hat
- Day Pack
- Flashlight

How is meat handled?

If you take your meat with you, you'll need your own coolers to do so. If you leave your meat for processing to be shipped later, we will have to obtain a transport permit from the Division of Wildlife, therefore, please let us know once you arrive at camp so that arrangements can be made with the game warden. If you plan on donating your meat, we require a check payable to us in the amount of \$175.00 to cover the cost of processing. We simply do not have the freezer space to store unprocessed game meat.

How much do I tip my guide and cook?

I am often asked, "How much do I leave my guide and cook as a tip?" This is a hard question, because a gratuity is left to show consideration for a job well done. Everybody's opinion of what that is worth is a bit different. From my experience over the past 25 years and after speaking with several other credible outfitters the following is a good rule of thumb. If you, the client, feel that your guide worked hard for you, was knowledgeable about the country and wildlife, and did everything in his control to ensure you an enjoyable quality hunt; then no less than 10% of the cost of the hunt is what we suggest, and is more or less the industry standard.

Also, please don't forget the cook and other camp help. As for the cooks, most all of our hunts have 4 to 6 hunters in camp at any one time. If each hunter leaves the cook with at least \$100.00 that provides the cook with a comparable gratuity to the guides.

Please consider this, our guides scout on their own time in the summer and fall, usually making several trips, to ensure their client the best opportunity at a trophy animal. They also use their own vehicle and their own personal equipment (i.e. binoculars, spotting scopes, cameras, etc). Prior to the hunt, our cooks spend a lot of their own time planning and preparing meals. They are the first ones up each morning, the last ones to bed each night, and stay busy in camp all day cleaning up or getting ready for the next meal.

Again, I want to reiterate that a tip is a personal expression of gratitude; therefore a definitive value is difficult to determine, however for those who pose the "how much" question, these are simply some industry guidelines that I have observed over the past 25 years, and felt that it would be helpful information to you, our clients.

What about your staff and leases?

As with any successful outfitter, the principles of success are, first, the country he is fortunate enough to hunt, and secondly, the quality and knowledge of the guides and cooks he has representing his organization. Now it may seem like I'm bragging, but once again we have the staff and leases that

deserve to be bragged about. I just can't say enough about the quality of our cooks and guides, not only as guides, but as people. They work hard every minute of every day and with great enthusiasm.

What kind of facilities do you hunt out of?

In all cases, we can drive to our camps, behind locked gates. Our camps range from tent camps, to cabins, from ranch houses to the large lodges. The lodge and ranch house facilities have indoor plumbing, showers, etc., comfortable beds and mattresses, sleeping in sleeping bags. The cabin camps have 10'x 12' cabins, with two hunters in each cabin; they also have a larger dinning cabin for eating and gathering. The other hunts are tenet camps.
