Keep in mind this is our average, when most boast about shooting an occasional 300 plus, the 325 is average because most hunters are very pleased with a bull that does not score this high, anything they see is bigger than any bull elk that they have ever shot..

This also means that on the other end of the scale we have taken several 350 bulls, good things come to those that wait. We take larger than 350 but they are occasional, so I don't even speak about them except when we get one. Be willing to pass a few because we get every year.

We are strong believers that the hunter owns the trigger, we do not force you to pass one that you want to shoot, it is your hunt. We are just here to facilitate in getting you to where these big bulls live. Of course we don't have any trophy fees as well.

For those that are meat hunters, these options except for cow elk, are limited. If you have a filled freezer but your living room walls or den are bare, and you are flat looking for horns, here is where you can go to fill that open wall space, with a rack that people coming to you home will notice the mule deer or elk on the wall first thing. Big old bucks and big old bulls of trophy quality are not the same table fare as a 2-year-old bull or buck.

Weather it is a 325 bull or one smaller, the adventure begins with meeting a bull in his own habitat. "He's Coming In" as they say. Hunt during the September rut or later. The extra incentive of this hunt which few other hunts have, in fact there are currently not any that come to mind that you can rut hunt with a R*I*F*L*E not a muzzleloader, not just a bow as in many states but a hi-Power Rifle, with a Scope. This directly adds to the high success in taking big mature bulls. As the season breaks into October, you will begin seeing migrant bulls of all sizes. Forest fires of the last 10 years have rejuvenated what was once heavy timber cover into a large food source for the elk and it has made hunting visibility much better for us as well.

You will be hunting trophy areas and all trophy hunters know that the points that you have or more so don't have can be a stumbling block between getting a Wyoming Trophy area license and not. We are extremely good at making certain that we have others with points available to get you points after you use yours the first year. When you hunt with us the first year we always get you a Special Buck or special Bull license. This along with the points we have in the pool allow you to draw with the needed point, even at 0 or 1 point for us to work with. We do that by always putting in for the special buck and bull license every time. This is extremely important when you only have 0 points after you hunt with us the first year. Without this service it would take you 3 to 12 years to draw the trophy areas.

What we are famous for is to get you a license for this trophy area, starting with points below the draw point. Then make you hunt as comfortable and successful while you take this big bull in his own environment using his natural protective knowledge and skill to make him successful. You meet him on his own ground, home turf, face to face. One of you will walk away, and the other one won't. This is the challenge that you have for one of the most desired trophies in the world, a 6-12-year-old Rocky Mountain Bull Elk. There are no ropes or fences on this hunt, it is all knowledge and skill that defines the winner of the match.

Don't wait for the elk to migrate to the lower ground, on an annual migration which without snowfall may be weeks after the elk season end, come up and get them where they are now.

The ability to hunt different camps makes it much easier to provide you with a hunt that fits your physical ability options:

1. A lodge, short truck drive to base camp, and a short morning ride to where the elk corridors are located.
2. If you are ok with spending the night in a wooden floored Outfitters tent, with generator electricity all night for C-Pap, and other electricity conveniences, followed by a short morning ride to where the elk corridors are located.
3. The ones wanting a more rugged hunt we have the Traditional Elk Pack in Hunt. This begins with a 10-mile horse riding pack in hunt. To a comfortable Wilderness camp in the Wyoming Rocky Mountains. From there you will walk out or in some cases ride out to different elk migration corridors to hunt each day.

The Deer hunting is better or in some places since you are hunting the Mule Deer Migrants for the winter you can intercept them on the way to one of the top 5 places to hunt Trophy Mule Deer in the United States. The points are required in some hunts, no points as you start your hunt location farther away. Pricing and even more so the points that you must draw the license is probably the biggest factor.

Now that that is said, let's get down to shooting 320 plus Bull Elk, and 180 Plus mule deer.

Now trophy quality is what we excel in as in trophy elk, mule deer, pronghorn antelope, moose or bighorn sheep hunts. These hunts are all guided fair chase, free range, migratory, multi state big game and trophy species. Also offering summer fly fishing, pack trips, trail rides and shooting school experiences.

We are here to make you good at what you need to do to be successful in these hunts for quality animals. If you already have the skills required, then you are even 1 step further in seeing your dream become a reality.

We are well known for the quality that we provide on our guided hunting trips. The Greater Yellowstone Region of Wyoming has been known as a prime elk hunting destination for more than 100 years. While Yellowstone Park is an exceptional sanctuary for elk, most leave for the winter. This migration provides an advantage for hunters.

Elk Hunting Opportunities

We offer three elk hunting experiences in Wyoming: one is archery or rut hunt, another is our rifle post-rut hunt— and then, our rifle migration hunt. All include top-quality trophy elk hunting opportunities. You can choose from any one of our camps located within the Bridger-Teton National Forest, with a resident and migrating herd of elk on their way to the feed grounds numbering well over the Wyoming Game & Fish Departments annual objective. If you're not looking for a pack-in experience, you may want to consider our drive-in camp, ranch cabin hunt or our beautiful lodge located outside of town, just off the Green River.

Elk Hunting Camps

All but one of our camps are located outside of the wolf and grizzly bear recovery zones, so they have had little effect on elk populations. These are resident herds of elk residing on the Wyoming Range all year long and wintering on elk feed grounds. The number of elk in this area is above objective and continually increasing ever year, coupled with high bull to cow ratio, this gives way to better hunting opportunities to harvest a trophy bull elk.

Like most big game hunts, we leave camp well before daylight for this hunt. However, because elk are often not found in as high in elevation as some big game, we might not need to ride as far, making this hunt not as physically demanding. A typical day of elk hunting is spent riding, glassing and hiking to various vantage points to look for elk. Our rifle elk season opens September 20th after the opener of mule deer season, giving experienced guides plenty of opportunity to locate bulls. This is a general license elk area, but we recommend the purchase of a preference point each year to increase the possibility for drawing a license the year you are ready to hunt.

Mule Deer hunting in Wyoming is one the most sought after, exciting, migratory and free ranging big game animals in the world to pursue. Mature bucks are mostly nocturnal, extremely cagey, and make for a very challenging hunt. The mountains and plains of Western Wyoming are famous for producing trophy class bucks and are home to one of the top five mule deer herds in the world. There are several factors specific to our areas which allow our bucks to grow and reach their genetic potential at maturity. These factors include a high buck to doe ratio, outstanding genetics, predators kept in check and fabulous habitat. The quality winter range is a great benefit to our deer herds as well, giving them the nutrition necessary to survive the harsh Wyoming winters. Along with these factors, the Wyoming draw system has kept the hunting pressure low, and because the season ends prior to the Rut, our bucks have an even better chance at reaching their genetic potential at maturity.

Our camp lies within the boundaries of areas 143 and 144, which allows us easy access and the ability to hunt both best areas in Wyoming for trophy mule deer. These areas routinely produce bucks ranging from 170” to well over 200” gross, each year. Our season runs from the 15th of September thru the 6th of October, offering us a wide range of hunting opportunities, such as hunting bucks in their bachelor groups as well as bucks just coming out of velvet. These reasons are why these Areas are without a doubt, not only Wyoming’s finest trophy mule deer hunting areas, but also considered some of the best trophy mule deer hunting in the world.

Along with hunting in an area with superior genetics and low pressure (from both hunters and predators), another key to success in a trophy mule deer hunt is our preseason scouting. Forty-five to sixty days prior to our first hunt, we are glassing with high quality optics in the mornings and evenings, which always prove beneficial to our clients and contributes greatly to the odds of harvesting a trophy while on your hunt of a lifetime.

Our hunts take place in Western Wyoming's high country, with elevations up to 7,000 feet and over 10,000 feet in many cases. You will be hunting high alpine bowls, boulder fields, rocky slides, and timber areas often higher than 9,000 feet.

Your mornings will begin at 3:00 am, at which time your guides are already catching, feeding, and saddling horses. We will all meet in the dining tent for a hearty breakfast; pack your lunch and discuss the plans for the day. After breakfast, still well before daylight, you and your guide will ride from camp and head up the trails a horseback for a full day of hunting. Once you reach your destination, we will spend most of the day glassing and locating bucks with binoculars and/or a spotting scope. Our time and efforts are focused on areas where we have historically found and recently located mature bucks in our scouting efforts once we spot your trophy game, we plan our stalk carefully and hike to a vantage point to where you can make your shot.

In summary, the rugged and steep terrain is challenging. This is a mentally and physically demanding hunt, one you will need to start preparing for long before your hunt dates. The better shape you are in, the better your chances of success. It is also very important to be familiar and proficient with your firearm because it is often necessary to shoot from an average of 300 yards, after a long hard hike up the mountain. The rough mountainous terrain of the Wyoming Range has more record class mule deer than any other part of Wyoming and most of the country; in fact, Lincoln County Wyoming was ranked #5 in the nation for record book mule deer. This is without a doubt the hunt of a lifetime for that hunter who is looking for a true trophy class mule deer buck.
